BELIZE MISSION TRIP

It's hard to believe that our mission team leaves for Belize in just two weeks! As they continue to prepare for their departure, the team wants to offer a huge thank you to everyone who supported the "backpacks for Belize" program. Due to your generous donations, our church was able to contribute forty-four backpacks to the program! You truly are a blessing to the children of Seine Bight!

At a recent in-person meeting, our team, consisting of pastor Mark, DCE Chloe, Arie Sauder, Hannah Schauer and Laurie Mathiesen, was finally able to meet the rest of the team with whom they are serving. Over a Belizean style lunch, the team discussed housing, food, travel, customs and the various service opportunities planned for when they arrive in Belize.

Several of the males on the team will be constructing a 10x10 addition to a small hut and fixing a shower in the existing unit. The ladies will either be assisting a medical professional with home visits, running a mini VBS, and/or tutoring school children in reading skills. In addition, both groups will be leading Bible studies.

The team flies into Belize City on June 14th and then travels to Seine Bight via vans on June 15th. In Seine Bight, the team will be staying in condos where they will prepare some of their own food and be provided with food by the people of the community.

On their return to Belize City on June 20th, they will be stopping briefly at an elderly care facility to deliver some items and visiting some Maya ruins as well. They will arrive back in Chicago late in the evening of the 21st.

The team is continuing to ask for prayers for safe travel, as well as for safety while staying and traveling in Belize, that the tasks at hand will be accomplished without difficulty or complications, and that God's love will be shown to all they encounter.





IN THE KNOW: **BUILDING RENOVATION**



If you've wandered into the church building lately, you may have noticed a few things have gone missing... like walls and ceilings and doors, and some things have moved to different locations...like the front doors and the doors going into the gym. Some things have been added, too, like a new entrance on the parking lot side and even an extra window. The construction crew, consisting mostly of members of our congregation, has been working just about every day, either knocking things down, moving things, replacing things, taking things apart or building new things, and the transformation thus far is pretty incredible!

Next on the docket is erecting a temporary wall in the narthex to keep dust levels to a minimum in the rest of the church and to keep our members safe as the construction continues. Following the completion of that, a section of the block wall by the bathrooms will come down and then the plumbing renovations will begin.
